Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Matthew Blair called the meeting of the Ohio Lottery Commission to order at 12:00 p.m.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

Commissioner Sweeney moved to approve the October 8, 2025, meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Gupta. The motion was affirmatively voted upon by the other Commissioners present.

Approval of three (3) Scratch-Off Games in Proposed and Final Form

Marty Morrow, Deputy Director of Product Innovation, presented three (3) Scratch-Off Games in Proposed and Final Form:

- OLC Operating Procedure 1076: *Electric 8's (\$1.00)*
- OLC Operating Procedure 1077: *Aces and 8's (\$5.00)*
- OLC Operating Procedure 1079: *Wild Cash Tripler (\$30.00)*

\*\* The November agenda had four (4) Scratch-Off Games in Proposed and Final Form listed. OLC Operating Procedure 1078: *Cross Match Bingo (\$10.00)* was not presented at this time; it will be brought forward for presentation at a future meeting. \*\*

Chairman Blair moved to approve three (3) Scratch-Off Games in Proposed and Final Form, with Commissioner Candisky offering a second to the Motion. The Motion was affirmatively voted upon by the Commissioners present.

Approval of three (3) No-Change Administrative Rules in Final Form

Daniel Carter, Acting Chief Legal Counsel, presented three (3) No-Change Administrative Rules in Final Form:

- 3770:2-1-01 - Authority and purpose
- 3770:2-1-02 - Incorporation of by-laws
- 3770:2-9-01 - Severability

Chairman Blair moved to approve three (3) No-Change Administrative Rules in Final Form, with Commissioner Brady offering a second to the Motion. The Motion was affirmatively voted upon by the Commissioners present.

Approval of one (1) new EZPLAY® Game in Proposed and Final Form

Daniel Carter, Acting Chief Legal Counsel, presented one (1) new EZPLAY® game in Proposed and Final Form.

- OLC Operating Procedure 982 - *\$1.00 Buckeye 7's*—EZPLAY® Game

Chairman Blair moved to approve one (1) new EZPLAY® game in Proposed and Final Form, with Commissioner Gupta offering a second to the Motion. The Motion was affirmatively voted upon by the Commissioners present.

Resolution to Approve nineteen (19) new Video Lottery Terminal (VLT) Game Themes

Daniel Carter, Acting Chief Legal Counsel, presented a Resolution to approve nineteen (19) VLT game themes.

Chairman Blair moved to approve the Resolution with nineteen (19) VLT game themes with Commissioner Szollosi offering a second to the Motion and the Motion was approved by all Commissioners present.

Office of Finance Report

Chief Fiscal Officer Ed Slyman provided the financial update for the month of October. The total traditional lottery games sales for the month of October totaled \$363.1 million, an increase of \$1.8 million or 0.5% versus last year. Mr. Slyman informed the Commission that sales came in at \$8.2 million, or 2.2% below forecast. Daily Draw games generated \$64.5 million, up \$2.7 million or 4.3% compared to last year. Mr. Slyman noted that this is a positive turnaround, considering sales in this category were down last month.

Mr. Slyman reported that Multistate games sales were \$28.9 million, up \$5.8 million, or 25%. Mega Millions led the way with \$15.2 million in sales, representing a 90% year-over-year increase. Mr. Slyman noted that this surge was primarily driven by the elevated jackpot, which reached \$754 million. Keno continued its upward trend with \$52.5 million in sales, up \$0.6 million, or 1.2%. This marks the 6<sup>th</sup> consecutive month of growth. Quick Play sales totaled \$12.8 million, which is down \$0.5 million, or 3.7% from last year. Scratch-Off game sales in October were \$194.2 million, down \$4.6 million or 2.3% compared to last year. The \$10 price point led all price categories with \$46.2 million in sales, accounting for 23.8% of total scratch-off sales. The \$20 price point followed with \$42.9 million,

representing 22.1% of sales. Holiday themed games contributed \$37.9 million, or 21.7% of total scratch-off sales. Mr. Slyman informed the Commission that sales for the first four weeks of the holiday campaign were down \$0.9 million, or 2.5% compared to the same period in 2024.

Total prize expense for the month was \$247.1 million, which is 68.1% of sales or higher than average. Mr. Slyman stated that this increase was driven by higher-than-normal payouts in Pick 4, Pick 5, and scratch-off games. VLT revenue for the month of October was \$119.7 million. Of this, \$79.2 million was distributed to the Racinos as commissions earned, and \$40.1 million represented revenue for the Ohio Lottery. YTD, VLT revenue has increased by \$24.6 million, or 5.4% compared to the first four months of last year.

Lastly, CFO Slyman reported that the year-to-date operating expenses were \$18.6 million, which is consistent with projected figures.

#### Director's Update

In honor of Veteran's Day, Director Michelle Gillcrist began by recognizing all of the Veterans. Director Gillcrist reported that the lottery's transfer to the Lottery Profit's Education Fund (LPEF) for the month of October was approximately \$122.1 million and this represents profits from traditional products and VLTs. This is approximately \$1.6 million more than our budgeted commitment for the month, and \$3.3 million more than last October. Director Gillcrist stated that Fiscal Year-to-Date, profits are \$13.8 million above the budgeted commitment, and \$24.3 million ahead of last year.

Director Gillcrist informed the Commission that the Cash Explosion Facing Hunger Drive that is held every year made a significant donation to the Akron – Canton Foodbank, thanks to the generosity of our Cash Explosion fans.

Director Gillcrist invited Nick Ciofani, Deputy Director of Communications, to follow up on a question regarding State spending on education.

Director Gillcrist recognized three employees retiring in the month of December: Ed Beaune, Ruth Stillerman, Todd Stillerman from the Sales department and Marie Kilbane from the Communications department.

Lastly, Director Gillcrist shared a 30 second spot from the Holiday campaign this year "*Holiday Pie 30.*"

#### ADJOURNMENT

With no further business before the Ohio Lottery Commission, Chairman Blair informed Commissioners that the next meeting will be held on December 10, 2025, at 12:00 p.m. via teleconferencing and in person. The meeting was adjourned at approximately 12:44 p.m.
